

COLORING

GOAL: To develop fine motor skills, crayon control, and concentration.

Coloring will help your student develop gross motor and fine motor skills. The coloring motions and crayon grip will help the development of the muscle in fingers, hands, wrists, as well as hand-eye coordination. Coloring will also help your student develop color recognition and awareness. Use the following pages to color the pictures and talk about "realistic colors" (red apple, brown horse, etc.). Encourage proper pencil grip development by reinforcing crayon grip when coloring.


TIP: Try to remind your student to stay in the lines and use their "helper hand" (the non-dominant hand) to hold and move the paper.







